

Guam Testing Sites for Herbicides.

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Ladies and Gentlemen,

Hafa Adai and Hello! I have compiled a list of areas that have been clearly identified by Guam Veterans in need of testing if I am to possibly come back to Guam and identify these locations.

These are the items we will need for the collection of soil samples at USAF and US Naval properties. USGS topo maps dated from 1968 through 1976 island wide showing above ground pipelines. Plus if possible aerial photos of the below listed locations. I believe these materials will be on record at the University of Guam if not we will need to get them delivered to Guam in an expeditious manner.

If granted access to all DOD properties that are in use or, not the following are on our list to be tested for 2,4-D/ 2,4,5-T and 2,4,5-TP (Silvex) and 2,3,7,8-TCDD (dioxin)
All security fence lines interior and exterior or, former fence where known spraying operations had taken place on locations at Andersen AFB and Navy Base Guam.

USAF- Marbo Barracks (abandoned)

USAF-Marbo Barracks Fire Station 3# (abandoned)

USAF-Marbo Barracks Laundry

USAF- POL Wash Rack

USAF- Andersen AFB Fire Fighting School #2

USAF- Drum Storage Lot

USAF-Bomber Revetment Area's (Whiskey 7)

USAF- Fuel Tank Farms

USAF- Urano Cliffs

USAF- Northwest Field

USAF-Tarague Beach Road

USAF- USAF area of responsibility Pipeline Road.

USAF- Any and all water wells that had been shut down due to contaminants up to and including pesticides, herbicides and rodenticides, TCE, or PCE that contain known carcinogens as per the US EPA .

USAF- All sites named in the ATSDR Report for Andersen AFB as per the CDC and identified by the US EPA.

Navy Base Guam Properties as follows:

Polaris Point, Apra Harbor access to all inner and outer fences,

US Naval Weapons Magazine (abandoned)

Sasa Valley Tank Farms

Naval Communications Station (abandoned)

NCS Water Wells A & B and other water wells that had been shut down due to contaminants up to and including pesticides, herbicides and rodenticides, TCE, or PCE that contain known carcinogens as per the US EPA.

Naval Air Station Agana now part of A.B Won Pat International Airport, Agana, Guam to include any and all locations.

NAS Agana Former Base Housing now low income housing.

US Navy's area of responsibility for the former "Pipeline Road".

Fena Lake Reservoir soil sediments.

US Naval access roads including Mt. Tenjo Vista Road.
